- 1.1 Develop new or improved knowledge partnerships between businesses, knowledge institutions, public administrations and end users with a view to long-term cooperation (post project) on developing products and services
- Number of enterprises cooperating with new/improved knowledge partnerships

- 1.2 Enhance regional innovation support capacity to increase long-term innovation levels and support smart specialisation strategies
- Number of improved or new innovation support measures launched for enterprises









Priority 1 – Thinking Growth

- 1.3 Stimulate the public sector to generate innovation demand and innovative solutions for improving public service delivery

- 1.2 SHINE New business models for health care economy







The rejected projects

- Weak results (outputs/deliverables)
- Weak logic
- Weak transnationality
- Activities do not match objectives
- Weak added value
- Lack focus
- Insufficient benefit outside the partnership
- Insufficient understanding of state aid and other financial issues
