The almost ready concept

- + Advanced in its development
- + Established consortium
- + Clear budget frame
- + Clearly defined objective
- + Clear indication of project results

Next step is the Expression of Interest







General principles

- + Approved activities only
- + 50% funding Paid as reimbursement
- + Beneficiaries in application only
- + Costs required for implementing the project only
- + No double funding
- + No maximum or minimum project budgets







Content of the Expression of Interest

Four steps

- + Main information
- + Project description
- + Project objectives and expected results
- + Project budget

Project description

- + Project summary
- + The shared territorial challenge(s)
- The approach to address the shared challenge(s) - including what is new about this approach
- + Why transnational cooperation is needed







Project objectives and expected results

- + The overall project objective [What do we want to achieve with the project]
- + The expected project results

[How do we measure the outcome of the pilots and what is the baseline for the measurement]

+ The project detailed objectives

[What is the major steps towards achieving the overall objective]







Indicators

- + Read Fact Sheet 23! Don't get rejected for technicalities!
- + Check programme definitions of indicators '**deliverables**', '**outputs**' and '**results**'
 - Result indicators are essential at EoI stage– they must measure the benefit from carrying out the project

Project budget

- + Overview of the project partners [Basic information of your partners, their budget and their role in the project]
- + The role of the partners

[What is the partner's role in the project]

+ Investments

[Description and explanation - clear justification]







Location of beneficiaries and expenditure

- + **Key message**: As a basic rule all beneficiaries, activities and expenditure have to take place inside the boundaries of the North Sea Region.
- + Exception to the rule
- + Max. 20% of eligible budget per project can be allocated to beneficiaries and activities outside North Sea Region area





Roles and responsibilities

- + Every project has a **Lead Beneficiary**, who has overall responsibility for ensuring the project is delivered according to plan
- + **All beneficiaries** responsible for own activities and accuracy of expenditure
- + **Local partnerships**: Coordinating beneficiary and cobeneficiaries (same country!)







Private sector beneficiaries

- + Private sector beneficiaries can be a risk factor but also be an asset
- + Changing from normal business practices some examples of requirements and additional rules:
 - State aid
 - Documentation
 - Revenue
 - Tendering







State Aid

- + Dependent on activities competitive advantage? distortion of competition?
- + Three options available:
 - + No Economic Advantage (*not* for for-profit enterprises)
 - + *de minimis*: Max €200,000 over 3 fiscal years*
 - + General Block Exemption Regulation (GBER): €2 million per beneficiary (only applies to SMEs)
 - + Beneficiaries under de minimis or GBER are exempt from programme rules on tendering and revenue generation
